Free tax assistance offered at Maurer School of Law. Students from the Indiana University Maurer School of Law and Kelley School of Business on the Bloomington campus are providing free tax assistance to low-income, elderly, disabled and limited English-speaking residents over the next month.

These students are participating in the Internal Revenue Service's Volunteers in Tax Assistance (VITA) program at the law school, 211 S. Indiana Ave., in Room 122. The walk-in clinic will run from 5 - 8 p.m. on Wednesdays and Thursdays through **March 12**. All program volunteers are trained and certified by the IRS.

Those with an annual income of \$49,000 or less are eligible for the free tax preparation help, provided they have not received income from the sale of stocks, mutual funds or homes, and do not own businesses.

Latex allergy is an emerging health issue believed to affect 5-10% of health care workers. While statistics are unavailable for the prevalence of latex sensitivity or allergy in the general population, it is estimated that between 1 and 6% of the general population may be affected. Symptoms can range from mild to severe and can be potentially life-threatening. There is no "cure" for this health condition. Avoidance of latex-containing products is the only way to prevent a reaction.

In order to prevent exposure to natural rubber latex we are asking that balloons that are made of latex not be used in school.

**IMPORTANT NOTICE:** For the safety of students exiting and boarding school buses, the bus lane (circular drive at the north end of the school) is **CLOSED TO ALL** traffic except

ALL STUDENTS parking in a Bloomington North parking lot are required to have a parking permit clearly displayed from their vehicle's rear view mirror. As of Tuesday September 1, security will begin issuing tickets to those vehicles without a permit displayed. A student will receive two warning tickets before their vehicle is towed. On the third offense, the vehicle will be towed, at the owner's expense.

Bloomington North issues parking permits for the safety and welfare of its students. This is the only system administrators have to control who parks in school lots. In addition, should something happen to your child's vehicle or should they leave their lights on (...or get out, lock the doors & leave the engine running....it's happened!!!!) the only method school officials have to determine who the vehicle belongs to, is by permit number.
